MEP URGES GOVERNMENT TO BAN NITROUS OXIDE

Barry Andrews, MEP for Dublin, is urging the Irish Government to take decisive action by aligning with the recent decisions of other EU Member States and amending existing legislation to restrict access to nitrous oxide, popularly known as laughing gas - with the empty canisters at familiar sight on our streets and in our alleyways. Andrews emphasises the need for Ireland to keep pace with its European counterparts in addressing the growing concerns surrounding the recreational use of nitrous oxide.

Expressing his concern, Andrews stated: "While countries like Belgium and the Netherlands have already taken steps to lags behind. It's crucial for our government to amend existing legislation promptly." Andrews draws attention to Belgium's recent official ban on nitrous oxide after a significant in consumption, especially among the youth. The Netherlands and the UK have also taken measures to prohibit its recreational use, indicating a shift even in nations known for progressive views on drug use. Andrews labels laughing gas as this century's 'gateway drug' for young people.

The 2022 study from the European Monitoring Centre for Drugs and Drug Addiction, highlighted by Andrews, reveals that one in four Irish individuals has experimented

the psychoactive properties of nitrous oxide, existing legislation falls short of classifying it as a controlled substance under the Misuse of Drugs Act 1977. Andrews sheds light on the legal inconsistencies, stating, "While the Criminal Justice (Psychoactive Substances) Act 2010 prohibits the sale of psychoactive substances, which prohibits the sale of nitrous oxide for its psychoactive properties, nitrous oxide remains legally accessible for catering and industrial purposes. This legal gap allows its sale in small retail outlets and online, contributing to its prevalence.'

Further underscoring the ease of access, Andrews

points out: "Nitrous oxide can be easily obtained from websites, many of which boast about creating memorable moments and offering anonymity. One particular online 'retailer' emphasises its European production, free delivery, and even introduces 'flavours,' initially seemingly for whipped cream but ambiguously presented on the website."

Andrews concludes with a stark warning, "There is a general misconception among users that inhalation of nitrous oxide is safe. The momentary euphoria it offers is not worth the potentially life-altering and deadly effects. Immediate action is imperative to protect the well-being of our youth."



relevant legislation governing the possession of realistic imitation firearms in public places is outlined in the Act of 1990, which has been amended to include Section 9A. This section stipulates that anyone found in possession of a realistic imitation firearm in a public place without lawful authority or reasonable excuse can be charged with an offense. Those found guilty of this offense can face substantial fines or imprisonment, depending on the severity of the case.

MFP Andrews stated: "Incidents involving imitation firearms in Dublin are deeply troubling and have significant implications for public safety. We must recognise that the possession and use of these imitation firearms can result in grave consequences and pose a risk to the well-being of our communities."

Не further emphasised the importance of strict

enforcement of existing legislation, particularly Section 9A of the Act of 1990, which aims to regulate and restrict the possession of realistic imitation firearms in public places.



€1K A MONTH TO LIVE IN CRAMPED MOULDY ROOM IN PALMERSTOWN -**IRELAND'S RENTERS DESERVE BETTER**

A report in a national newspaper recently has shown that a mother and her 18-month old son are living in a damp, mould-infested one-bedroom apartment in Palmerstown at a cost of €1,000 per month. This is indicative of how bad Ireland's housing crisis has gotten, according to David Gardiner, Workers' Party rep. for Palmerstown-Fonthill.

PROGRESS TO RETROFIT OLDER COUNTY **COUNCIL HOMES WELCOMED**

Councillor Derren Ó Brádaigh has said that whilst progress is somewhat slow and overall numbers are low, he is encouraged by the headway being made to retrofit the Council's own housing stock. The Dublin Mid-West councillor represents Lucan and Palmerstown-Fonthill and was commenting in relation to queries he has made recently.

Cllr Ó Brádaigh said "Deep retrofits of the Council's housing stock are not only an essential requirement as set out by the Local Authority Retrofit Programme, that requires our Council to their housing upgrade stock to a B2 standard, but also represents a crucial investment toward driving carbon emissions down and keeping families and particularly older residents warm in their homes.

"Our Council have 9,787 dwellings in their ownership and have identified 449 homes as needing retrofitting works since they began carrying out deep energy retrofits in 2021. This figure in itself represents less than 5% in need of such upgrades, and I am informed that 248 have been completed to

that any homes already approved for window and replacements door are completed in tandem.

Cllr Ó Brádaigh added "In relation to the remainder of homes, I have received data that says 185 homes are listed for completion in the 'immediate period'. The timeframe to complete properties has been issued to an obligated party to survey is between 1-3 months.

Cllr Ó Brádaigh also said "Energy efficiency works in Council buildings are progressing and this is to be welcomed. This includes upgrading office lighting to LED. Last October I paid a visit to the District Heating

INTRODUCTION OF CONTACTLESS PAYMENTS TECHNOLOGY **MUST BE PRIORITISED FOR DUBLIN BUS**

The introduction of contactless payments technology on Dublin buses and across the transport network should be prioritised for all passengers, according to a Fine Gael TD. Deputy Emer Higgins has called on the National Transport Authority (NTA) to prioritise the roll-out of next generation ticketing in Dublin and for the whole public transport network which would allow passengers to use a credit. debit card or smartphone to pay for fares.

Deputy Higgins said: "We live in an almost cashless society now which was in large part brought about by the pandemic. "On routes operated by Dublin Bus, passengers can only pay by coins if they don't have a LEAP card and no change

is given onboard. In an era where most people have smartphones, there should be an option to pay using contactless technology. previously called for the NTA to provide virtual Leap cards for use on all public transport as Ireland remains a total outlier in Europe by not being able to provide for digital payments for some transport

"We are increasingly dependent on being able to pay for our goods and services on our phones and cards. In the past year there have been 1.1 billion of these transactions in Ireland. "There will always be times where people don't have change when paying a fare on Dublin Bus and may have forgotten or lost their LEAP card. In other

cases, people may not have a LEAP card because they don't use public transport frequently so need the option to pay cash. "We should accommodate passengers in every scenario, and people who prefer to use cash must also be respected and facilitated.

"We also need to be able to offer the full range of payment options to passengers and that includes digital public transport cards. "The capital is continuing to grow with more people arriving to the city to live, work and socialise and it is therefore essential that we introduce contactless payment options across the entire public transport network. "Expressway, which serve city centres destinations in Dublin, Cork, Limerick, Galway, Sligo and Waterford, as well as rural and local services, already has onboard terminals that can take Contactless Debit/Credit Card, Apple Pay, Google Pay and Leap Card payments. The TFI Go App is also another option for Bus Éireann

"The Chairperson Delegate of the National Transport Authority recently confirmed it will soon appoint a supplier in the first three months of this year to build the next generation ticketing platform, which will deliver account-based ticketing across services. This will facilitate the use of mobile phones, contactless bank cards and other digital forms of payment. "Peter Strachan

told the Oireachtas Transport Committee earlier this month that 90% of passenger journeys in London are paid for with Smart card or contactless, according to their transport authority. "Mr Strachan claimed that Ireland is currently two to three years away from this level of digital payment given where the technology is now. However, he said the board of the NTA want to accelerate this as much as possible and I will be calling on them to keep the public informed as much as possible on when it can be expected. "Anything that makes life easier for commuters and visitors to our capital and encourages more people to use public transport to ease congestion on our roads would be a positive step," Deputy Higgins concluded.





The all-new Skoda ENYAQ Coupe iV is based on the Vision iV concept introduced in 2019, and it features an elegant, timeless design with clean lines and the sporty silhouette of a coupe. Shaped to achieve superior aerodynamic efficiency, the ENYAQ Coupe iV is distinguished from the regular ENYAQ iV not only by its silhouette, but also by its bodycolour sills, distinctive bumpers, and stylish rear spoiler. The all-electric ENYAQ Coupe iV's dominant characteristics are its long range, zero emissions, state-of-the-art technology, and a dynamic driving experience. Depending on specification, the ENYAQ Coupé has a range of up to 545 km on the WLTP combined driving cycle. There is a choice of two battery sizes, rear- and all-wheel drive, plus power outputs ranging from 180hp to 295hp. Prices start from €56,710 inclusive of a 3-year maintenance and tyre plan.

Light & Airy Cabin.

A panoramic glass roof is standard for the ENYAQ Coupe iV. The front and rear windscreens form a unified design unit, adding to the car's attractiveness. The panoramic roof is fixed, and it is separated from the front and rear screens by padded cross-bars. From the inside, the panoramic roof takes up most of the ceiling area and it makes the cabin light and airy in the process, while a thermodynamic coating ensures that temperatures within the cabin are pleasant at all times. Just as with the regular ENYAQ iV, the coupé is available with the optional Crystal Face where the vertical ribs of the striking Skoda grille are illuminated by 131 LEDs, while a horizontal light strip rounds off the car's stunning look.

Trim & Battery Options.

The car's battery cells are incorporated into the floor, and this lowers the car's centre of gravity, which is important when driving around bends and for preserving the maximum amount of space for passengers and cargo. Two battery capacities are available: 62kWh and 82kWh, with usable capacities of 58kWh and 77kWh respectively. These are the basis for the names of the different versions of the car: iV 60 and iV 80 - both of which send power to the rear wheels, with the 80X variant (Coupe iV & Sportline iV only) benefitting from an all-wheel drive drivetrain. In terms of specification, the ENYAQ COUPÉ closely mirrors that of its SUV sibling, with Coupe iV (60 & 80), Sportline iV (60 & 80) and flagship RS (80 only) versions on offer.

Power & Charging Options.

Power output starts at 180hp with the rearwheel-drive ENYAQ Coupe iV 60. The ENYAQ Coupe iV 80, also rear-wheel-drive, produces 204hp from its 82-kWh battery. In addition to this larger battery, the ENYAQ Coupe 80X features a second motor on the front axle, making it all-wheel-drive, with a system output of 265hp. The outstanding aerodynamics of the ENYAQ Coupe contribute to the car's high level of efficiency. Meanwhile, the low drag coefficient has a positive impact on the vehicle's maximum range, which is up to 545 km WLTP for the ENYAQ Coupe 80. Charging the ENYAQ Coupe's batteries from 0-100% can be done via a domestic 7kW wallbox in 9.5 hours or 13 hours for the iV 60 and iV 80 respectively, but the charging times drop to just over 6 hours and 7.5 hours respectively via an 11kW wallbox charger. However, at a public DC fast charging station, the car can achieve a 5-80% charge in as little as 29 minutes (model and battery dependent).

Inspired By Modern Living.

The interior is defined by the Design Selections which are inspired by modern living environments and use natural, sustainably processed and recycled materials. With the exception of the 5.3-inch Digital Cockpit, which displays the most important driving information, everything else takes place on a central 13-inch colour touchscreen. The intuitive infotainment system provides access to Skoda Connect,

SmartLink, Bluetooth, Wi-Fi hotspot, and many other services, while the standard touch-slider can be used to change the music volume, zoom in and out of the navigation map, or change the air-conditioning temperature. Additionally, the system comes with a DAB radio, 2 x USB-C ports and 8 speakers as standard. The 2.77m wheelbase in the ENYAQ Coupe provides the driver and passengers with terrific levels of leg, elbow and head room, so that every journey can be completed in spacious luxury. The cavernous boot in the ENYAQ Coupe iV has a floor area of 1m squared, with a volume of 570-litres behind the rear seats, and it comes with a variable boot floor, cable storage bag, cargo restraint system and useful hooks to keep items in place.

Key Standard Equipment.

Standard specification across all trim variants includes: 19-inch "Proteus' alloy wheels, panoramic sunroof, LED headlights & tail lights, LED daytime running lights, chrome window surrounds, radiator grille with chrome surround, body-coloured door sills and bumpers, rear spoiler, Climatronic dual-zone air-conditioning, cruise control with speed limiter, keyless start/ stop, front & rear parking sensors, rear view camera, power-folding door mirrors, auto lights & wipers, 13-inch touchscreen display, navigation system, Bluetooth & voice control, Smartlink (Apple CarPlay and Android Auto), DAB radio, fabric & leatherette upholstery, front centre armrest, rear centre armrest, leather multi-function steering wheel, LED ambient lighting & footwell lights, 'Welcome' logo projection, ISOFIX child seat anchor points, multiple airbags, and a seat belt warning system, along with a host of driver assistance systems. was an optional 'Advanced Pack' incorporates a heads-up display, 'Crystal Face' illuminated front grille, heated windscreen, heated front & rear seats, and a Canton sound system. The ENYAQ Coupe iV 80 is a dynamic performer and, thanks to its 204hp and 310Nm of instant torque, it can complete a 0-100km/ h sprint in just 8.5-seconds, on its way to an electronically-limited 160km/h top speed. The car feels refined and self-assured on the road, and a well-judged suspension set-up ensures that rutted road surfaces are soaked up in a composed manner. The steering is wellweighted and precise in its operation, and this makes manoeuvring in and out of parking spaces a simple task - a task that is greatly aided by the standard front & rear parking sensors and a rear-view camera. The ENYAQ Coupe takes motorway driving in its stride and, with the provision of ample mid-range punch from the electric motor, overtaking slower moving traffic becomes a safe and predictable exercise. Thanks to multiple seat and steering wheel adjustment options, It is easy to find a perfect driving position, and the height-adjustable centre armrest enhances the relaxed driving experience.

Verdict & Pricing.

The new Skoda ENYAQ Coupe iV is a truly impressive fully-electric SUV-Coupe in every way - from its handsome good looks, to its plush and spacious cabin, cavernous boot, and generous equipment tally across all trim variants. It has a good real-world driving range, and it has a 1,000kg braked-trailer towing capacity in rear-wheel drive format, and this increases to 1,200kg in all-wheel drive guise. Pricing for the new Skoda ENYAQ Coupe iV starts at just €53,210 (iV 60, inclusive of an SEAI Grant of €3,500 for private buyers, where applicable) with my test car specification priced from €62,685 (quoted prices are on-theroad, including a tyre and maintenance plan). A 3-year/150,000km warranty comes as standard, along with 3-years Roadside Assistance and an 8-year battery warranty (T's & C's apply).

As Lisa, Abby and their team navigated the harsh reality while volunteering at The Hope Hospital Eye Clinic, they visited local street and slum communities where they provided eye health care to those living on the streets.

During their week-long trip, the team of expert opticians visited eleven different locations and gave eye checks to 2,414 patients, dispensed over 1,904 glasses, and in more severe cases, referred patients to Hope Hospital for surgery. For the majority of these people this was their first time ever seeing an Optician and availing of the basic of eye health care that we often take for granted here in Ireland.

One of those patients was Clara Halder, a 56-year-old community care giver. A hugely passionate reader, books have always been Clara's escapism from reality, however in recent years she has struggled with deteriorating vision. What once brought her joy,

reading now brought her terrible headaches. Without opportunity or spend to see an Optician or Doctor about her eyesight, she found herself having to sacrifice her passion of reading. However, when Specsavers came to her local community with the mobile Eve Clinic she queued to be seen and was overjoyed when she was prescribed glasses and given a pair on the spot to take home. Speaking to Specsavers she said she 'can't believe she gets to take these glasses home and for nothing in return. This is a gift that you cannot possibly understand the value of. This will bring me back my joy, my peace and it's something for just me to have.

Despite the seemingly routine of the nature eye care provided, many individuals treated bγ Specsavers colleagues had never accessed such services before. Dr. Samran, CEO of The Hope Hospital, emphasised the significance of the visit, noting that 90% of cases of blindness could have been prevented if timely treatment was available. This highlights the critical impact of the Specsavers team's efforts in bringing essential eve care to those who had previously lacked access.

Eight-year-old Amaira Gulzar was brought to

the Specsavers eye clinic where she spoke of sore eves and headaches. On testing, it was clear that she needed glasses and of a very high prescription so the symptoms she complained of were not surprising. Amaira had never realised that she couldn't see clearly, assuming her vision was how all people saw things. On trying on glasses, she was overwhelmed and surprised, not quite believing the clarity she had been missing out on. Amaira was excited to get to school the next day to see how the blackboard would appear with her new glasses and was so thankful to Specsavers and Hope for giving her clear sight.

For the people seen by Specsavers on this trip to Kolkata, having glasses can be a life changing tool, be it to help in their education or help them to obtain work to support their families. This was the case for 57-year-old Dannu Prasad Ladar. A longhaul driver, Dannu is the sole provider for his family of a wife and three children. Struggling with cataracts in both eyes, Danny's job was becoming increasingly challenging and stressful, not to mention dangerous. He had refrained from seeking medical intervention in fear that he would lose his job and his family's source of income and also not be able to afford the healthcare. He speaks of the

Specsavers Night Clinic as a 'blessing I will be eternally grateful for'. Head of Optometry at TUD, Declan Hovenden, tested Dannu and refereed him to Hope Hospital for surgery where he would avail of double cataract surgery at no cost. Dannu was also prescribed glasses which would alleviate some of his vision issues in the meantime, allowing him to continue working until his surgery. The prescription would then be updated postsurgery at the Hope Hospital to better suit his needs. This support and care will ensure Dannu continues in his employment for many years to come, ensuring the ongoing support of his family.

Following her visit, Lisa Walsh said: 'I am so grateful that we got the opportunity to visit Kolkata with The Hope Foundation again this year. 'What's really wonderful about The Hope Foundation is that they are working alongside the street communities in Kolkata, and they are changing the lives of everyone in this community. It was a privilege to be there to help them on their journey and to see the benefit of our supports to the hundreds of people we treated. 'Everyone on the team from Specsavers rose to the challenge and really stepped up. They accept the difficult working conditions and give their everything, wanting to work morning and night'.

Abby said: This trip was really special. We were able to treat a lot of children and they were so excited to see us. It's incredible to think that something so small to us can have such a massive impact on others less fortunate.

At the end of their week-long volunteering trip, Specsavers presented a cheque of €135,000 to founder of The Hope Foundation, Maureen Forrest. This significant donation will play a vital role in sustaining the eye care clinic in Kolkata. Maureen Forrest, Founder of the Hope Foundation explains that this programme 'is the difference between life and death to people who can't feed their families. She continues: 'Vision is

everything to people and for us to be able to support them in their vision journey is a great privilege.

In addition to the staff from Specsavers, four optometry students from Technological University Dublin Dublin), Eimear Kilroy, Irene Finnerty, Brid Stack, and Ava Shiels and Paula James along with their Lecturer and Head of Optometry, Declan Hovenden travelled to Kolkata. Specsavers has an academic partnership with TU Dublin, providing expert mentorship and support to students of Optometry. The partnership is to help students develop necessary skill sets required to excel in a professional environment and in their studies, academic SO Specsavers were thrilled to be able to bring some students from the course to Kolkata to help with their mission.

The Hope Foundation Ireland is a registered Irish charity working with street and slum children in Kolkata. The charity works to free children and poor families from lives of pain, abuse, poverty, and darkness and seeks to improve their lives by providing access to healthcare and nutrition, education, drug rehabilitation and life skills and training. With the help of Specsavers and The Hope Foundation, improved eye care will be made available to the children living in slums and hospitals in Kolkata.
